

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and must attend a baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - 15 minutes before all Weekday Masses, as well as 3:30 p.m. on Saturday; or by appointment with the priest.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

A Message from Your Pastor Peace and goodness!

In today's Sunday readings, we are presented with two widows. Let us first consider that a woman in the time of Jesus gets her status in the society from either her father (if unmarried), husband (if married) or son (if the husband is dead). A widow without a son loses her status in the society.

In the first reading, we find a poor widow having nothing but a small amount of food and yet she was generous enough to give it to the prophet Elijah. Her generosity was paid back in return a thousand fold by God because she had put her life and that of her son in the hands of God and God took care of them. The Gospel presents to us another widow, her generosity was like that of the widow in the first reading. What she offered in the Temple, although in the eyes of many was very little, but in the eyes of God was great for she gave what she herself needed in order to live.

Often times, we are so stingy in giving to the Lord, not so much of material things but more on the time we spent with Him. We are so stingy too with our time with families because we are so concerned about a lot of petty and unimportant matters. Like the widow of the first reading, let us remember that our life is too short and we need to spend it well. If we place our lives with the Lord, we will discover the generosity and the love of our loving Father in Heaven.
