

DEVELOPMENT AND PEACE CAMPAIGN

To Make our Environment Free of Bottled Water

Recycling or the question of plastic not being recycled, is only one negative environmental impact of bottled water production and consumption. Bottled water is the end of a supply chain that includes some of the biggest polluters on the planet. Two primary raw materials for plastic bottles are polyethylene & terphthalate (PET) are derived from crude oil. Extraction of these materials involves both oil and petrochemical industries and contributes to environmental degradation and use of increasingly scarce natural resources.

The Earth Policy Institute estimates that U.S. demand for bottled water requires more that 17 million barrels of oil annually to produce the bottles. The production of plastic water bottles contributes to global warming, as CO_2 , sulfur dioxide and nitrogen are released. The Pacific Institute estimates that the total amount of energy in our use of bottled water is equivalent of filling a plastic bottle one quarter full of oil. One Canadian study estimates that only 48% of plastic bottles are recycled, and in the U.S. only 23% are recycled.

Please join us in our campaign to make our homes and Assumption Parish free of bottled water. Please sign the action card provided at the back & front of the church which will be sent to our government and politicians.
