

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and must attend a baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - By appointment only.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

Featured Saint of the Week.

St. James of the March, Priest (November 28) Saint James was born at Monteprandone in the year 1394. He studied at Perugia, specializing in law. After entering the Franciscan Order he studied theology, and after his ordination he spent the rest of his life preaching. He travelled through most of Italy and Europe spreading devotion to the Holy Name of Jesus and serving as envoy for the conversion of heretics. He died in Naples in the year 1476.

A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Peace and Goodness!

We begin a new liturgical year with the season of Advent that helps us re-focus our lives with the liturgy we celebrate. The readings for this Sunday gives us a lot of points to consider: God, who is "omnipresent" invites us to an intimate encounter in the Eucharist. Every time we celebrate the Eucharist, we enter "Kairos" (the time of the Lord), the heaven opens, and we encounter the powerful and transforming love of the Father in Jesus, through the Holy Spirit. Past, present, and future converges into one in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

In the first reading Jeremiah focus our attention on the promise God made to King David 1,000 years before Christ. God says he will fulfill the promise He made by springing forth a bud in the line of David. (Past)

The responsorial psalm focus on the day-to-day living, asking God for guidance. (Present).

Paul in the second reading, reminds us to strengthen our hearts in joyful preparation for the coming of Jesus, living an upright lives. (Present)

And finally, in the Gospel, Jesus asked us to be on guard for the "Parousia". Jesus will come at an unexpected time so we have to be vigilant. (Future).

Jesus (Priestly), and serving our brothers The liturgy we celebrate, keeps us on the right track and prepares us by living our Priestly, Kingly, and Prophetic function by looking on the Past and Future as interconnected so we can live the Present (Prophetic), celebrating the liturgy and praying with the High Priest, and sisters in charity (Kingly).

Advent is a time to begin once again, to re-focus, and to deepen our love of God and neighbour. Ave Maria!
