

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and must attend a baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - By appointment only.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

FUNERALS - Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial.

Featured Saint of the Week.

Blessed Rafal Chylinsky (December 2)

Blessed Rafal was born near Buk in the Poznan region of Poland on January 8, 1694. At a very young age, he already showed early signs of religious devotion.

In 1715 he joined the Conventual Franciscans in Krakow. He was ordained two years later. He ministered to flood and epidemic victims in Warsaw. Rafal was known for his simple and candid sermons, for his generosity, as well as for his ministry in the confessional. People of all levels of society were drawn to the selfsacrificing way he lived out his religious profession and priestly ministry. After his death, the Conventual church in that city became a place of pilgrimage for people throughout Poland. He was beatified in Warsaw in 1991.

<u>A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR</u>

Let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord!

Today, we begin the 40 days of advent preparing and waiting for the coming of the Messiah. We are invited by the Psalmist to go to the house of the Lord with shouts of joy! Let us try to plunge into the mystery of the Incarnation, the mystery of great love, of God uniting with the lowly estate of our humanity so that we might share in His divinity.

St. Francis called this "the feast of all feast". He was taken at awe by this sublime mystery. At the annunciation of the coming of Jesus, Mary asked the angel Gabriel: "How can this be"? She was trying to understand it because she wants to do the will of God. Her resignation to God was so perfect that she was able to reverse the disobedience of Adam and Eve. Even the "I will not serve" of the former Lucifer now named Satan was reversed into: "Be it done to me according to your Word". Her openness to God opened once again the world to God, its creator.

In this season of Advent, let us follow the example of Mary. Let us wait for the coming of Jesus with total openness to God.
