

#### **PASTORAL CARE**

**BAPTISMS** - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and must attend a baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

**CONFESSIONS** - By appointment only.

**MARRIAGES** - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

# Featured Saint of the Week

St. Nicholas Tavelic, Priest, and Companions, Martyrs

Nicholas Tavelic was born in Sibenik about the year 1340. Together with his brother Deodatus he was active as a preacher in Bosnia. Both went to Palestine in the year 1384. With the help of their confreres Peter and Stephen, they composed a Christian apologetic treatise. After fortifying themselves with prayer they read their treatise before the Qadi of Jerusalem in the year 1391. When they were ordered to retract their statements, they resolutely refused and were consequently condemned to death and their dismembered bodies were burned.

## <u>A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR</u>

#### Pax et Bonum!

In the Sacred Scriptures, widows take a prominent place in the heart of God. Why are they special in the eyes of God? Let us look closer on the widows in the scriptures. They were considered outcast in the community, having no status or standing because their standing and status in the community is attached to either their husbands or if the husband dies, it will be transferred to the son, if she has one. Being a widow and not having a son makes a nobody in the community. Because of this they find refuge only in God. Their total dependence on God made them special in the eyes of God.

The widow in the Gospel today was so trusting that even the little that she has, she was giving to the temple because she knew that God will provide for her. She recognizes that everything comes from the generosity of God. She gave not from her surplus but from what she herself needed.

We often give out of our surplus. The widow in today's Gospel teaches us that true generosity is born out of love, and we know that a loving heart is a generous heart. Generosity is never a question of amount but on the love we put in giving.

Our Father in heaven, out of his great love for us, gave us all that He has, His only begotten Son, so that we might live as His children.

Let us mold our hearts according to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus!
