

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and must attend a baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - By appointment only.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

FUNERALS - Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial.

Featured Saint of the Week

<u>St. Albert the Great, Bishop and Doctor of the Church (Nov.15)</u> St. Albert (1206-1280) was born in Germany and studied in Padua and Paris as a doctor of theology before joining the Dominicans. St. Thomas Aquinas was one of his pupils. A man of learning and a generous mind, St. Albert was instrumental to the reception of Aristotle. As bishop he worked to establish peace among peoples.

A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Peace!

Today, the readings and especially the Gospel reminds us that as members of the Church, we are wedded to Jesus, who is presented in the parable as the bridegroom of the bride (the Church).

We must look at the wedding tradition of the Jews to be able to understand the parable of today. Technically, the Jewish wedding process has two distinct stages: "kiddushin" (sanctification or dedication, also called "erusin", betrothal in Hebrew) and "nissuin" (marriage), when the couple start their life together.

The bethrotal already binds them legally although the bride still lives with her father until the bridegroom would get her to start living with him (nissuin).

This tradition reflects God's marriage to the church. The Old Testament is seen as the "kiddushin". The church is betrothed to God, but still is living in the world. We already belong to God for God bought us by his Son's blood. Then the Bridegroom (Jesus) came and lived amongst us. He will come again to bring us to His home in heaven.

The sacrament of Marriage is a mirror of God's love for the Church (us). This is why the Church reminds husbands that their love for their wife should reflect the love of Jesus for the Church.

We as members of the Church belongs to God. We are God's people, the flock He shepherds.

As Jesus was faithful to the Church as its Bridegroom, we as members of the church is asked to be faithful also to him. God bless you all!
