## Canadian 74ANKSGNING

Historical records show that the earliest idea of <u>Thanksgiving</u> was when the *indigenous people in North America* held feasts at the end of harvest during the Fall season. The <u>first Thanksgiving by</u> <u>European settlers</u> was in 1578 to celebrate their safe arrival after their trip across the ocean. Then, on November 14, 1606, Samuel de Champlain hosted a feast where the <u>indigenous people</u> of <u>Canada and the European settlers could dine</u> together, fostering a sense of unity as part of the "Order of Good Cheer" (L'Ordre de Bon Temps).

As a national celebration, it was observed some years after the then province of Canada was developed. This was in 1859, a significant year when the first Thanksgiving was held for the public in solemn recognition of God's mercies, marking a pivotal moment in our history. From 1867, the dates of the national celebration were at various intervals until November 6, 1879, when it became an annual event. After that, Parliament chose the date for each year and why they would celebrate until January 31, 1957, when Parliament officially made Thanksgiving the 2nd Monday in October. It was said to be "a day of general thanksgiving to Almighty God for the bountiful harvest with which Canada has been blessed."

Nowadays, some say that Thanksgiving is often tied to religion only for some people; most commonly, it has become a day for casual and quiet family gatherings. But is this the only truth? What are your thoughts on this?

This October 14, 2024, what are your reasons for observing THANKSGIVING DAY? Are you aware that the event's origin is a thankful, faith-based community of people? Do you have the same motivation as those men and women in the past? Are you conscious that all blessings come from our Provident God?
