

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and must attend a baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - 15 minutes before all Weekday Masses, as well as 3:30 p.m. on Saturday; or by appointment with the priest.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

St. Teresa of Jesus (October 15)

Born in Avila, Spain, St. Teresa (1515-1582) reformed the Carmelite Order with the help of St. John of the Cross. In the years and following the Ecumenical Council of Trent, she contributed to the renewal of the entire ecclesiastical community. Her active life did not distract her from contemplation, and she wrote several works of asceticism and mysticism. She was proclaimed Doctor of the Church in 1970...

The rich, young man, who was not named in the Gospel, echoes our desire to know what we have to do in this world to gain or inherit the bliss of the next life. Jesus told him to follow the laws and commandments. When he told Jesus he already had done all these things, Jesus looked at him with love and told him to sell all that he has and then come follow him. He then went away grieving for he had many possessions.

It is so ironical, if he is asking for eternal life, why is he so concerned about his possessions. Jesus was asking him to trust in God and this is the reason why in the first part of the Gospel, Jesus highlights the truth that only God is good. All goodness proceeds from Him because He is the source of all goodness. Moreover, if he truly believe that God is good, then God will never abandon him and would always be looking after him.

Only in detaching oneself from the world's goods can one be able to attach himself to God. We cannot serve both God and mannon. We are asked to use the things of this world and not to be enslaved by them. Money is not the end of everything; it is not the reason for living. We live not for money but for God because only in God do we find the true meaning of our lives.
