

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and must attend a baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - By appointment only.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

FUNERALS - Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial.

Featured Saint of the Week

Blessed Bartholomew of Vicenza, Bishop (October 27)

Bartholomew was born in Vicenza around 1200. At 20, he entered the Dominicans. Following his ordination, he served in various leadership positions. As a young priest, he founded a military order whose purpose was to keep civil peace in towns throughout Italy.

In 1248, Bartholomew was appointed a bishop. For most men, such an appointment is an honor and a tribute to their holiness and their demonstrated leadership skills. But for Bartholomew, it was a form of exile that had been urged by an antipapal group that was only too happy to see him leave for Cyprus. Not many years later, however, Bartholomew was transferred back to Vicenza. Despite the antipapal feelings that were still evident, he worked diligently—especially through his preaching—to rebuild his diocese and strengthen the people's loyalty to Rome. Bartholomew died in 1271, and was beatified in 1793.

A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Peace and Goodness!

The Gospel this Sunday projects the beauty of the ways of the Lord. It is ironic to see that the very first one, outside the disciples of our Lord to recognize and proclaims him as the Messiah was a blind man. Bartimaeus was physically blind, but his heart can clearly see Jesus as his Messiah. Jesus' healing Bartimaeus signalled that the Kingdom of God is near. In fact, the healing of Bartimaeus was the last miracle Jesus performs before entering Jerusalem for His final "hour".

The prophet Jeremiah in today's first reading prophesied the re-establishment of Israel and invites the people to be joyful and hopeful. Jesus fulfills this prophecy in the Gospel but with the Church, He continues to build the Kingdom of God with and in His Church in the hearts of those who seek Him, like that of Bartimaeus.

In our world today, there are those who can see physically but are actually blind and would not see the presence of God in their lives, but there are also those who might be physically blind but see clearly God in their lives. In this Jeremiah has this to say: "Hear this, O foolish and senseless people, who have eyes, but see not, who have ears, but hear not." May we search for Him while He can still be found!
