

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and you must attend a Baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - First Friday-(during exposition of the Blessed Sacrament), 8:30 am to 9:00 am; First Saturday - 9:30 am to 10:00 am By appointment only; Sundays - 11:30 am to 12:00 Noon, By appointment only.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

FUNERALS - Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial.

ALL SAINTS DAY & ALL SOULS' CELEBRATIONS NOVEMBER 1 & NOVEMBER 2

The first date commemorates all those who have attained the beatific vision in heaven. The origin of the festival of All Saints celebrated dates to May 13, 609 or 610, when Pope Boniface IV consecrated the Pantheon at Rome to the Blessed Virgin and all the martyrs; the feast of the *dedicatio Sanctae Mariae ad Martyres* has been celebrated at Rome ever since.

Pope Gregory III established the date of November 1 during his reign (731-741 AD) when he dedicated a chapel in Rome's St. Peter's Basilica in honour of all saints. Also, a festival of all the saints on November 1 was already widely celebrated in the days of Charlemagne. It was made a day of obligation throughout the Frankish empire in 835 by Louis the Pious, issued at the instance of Pope Gregory IV, who, in 837, with the consent of all the bishops, confirmed its celebration on November 1.

The next day, **All Souls' Day**, November 2, commemorates the departed faithful who have not yet been purified and reached heaven. We Catholics celebrate All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day in the fundamental belief that there is a prayerful spiritual communion between those in the state of grace who have died and are either being purified in purgatory or are in heaven and the living.

References to the belief in **Communion of Saints** date back to the 4th century. We proclaim it as a tenet in the **Apostles' Creed**. <u>The best</u> thing about the communion of saints is that it connects us all — because we are one body. When we celebrate the Eucharist, we pray with all who have gone before us. We can pray for the dead, "the souls in purgatory," who need prayers. The multitude in heaven pray for the rest of us, inspire us by their example, and remain present to us in ways we know not. **"I will spend my** heaven doing good on earth," said St. Thérèse of Lisieux before her death.



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
