

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and must attend a baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - By appointment only.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

FUNERALS - Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial.

Featured Saint of the Week.

<u>Saint John Leonardi, Priest (October 9)</u>

St. John (1541-1609) was born in Tuscany and after studying pharmacy, left this profession to be ordained a priest. He devoted himself to catechizing children; in addition, he gathered people to work with him in hospitals and prisons. He founded the Order of Clerics Regular of the Mother of God and later a society of priests to serve in foreign missions, which later became the Society for the Propagation of Faith.

A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Peace, Joy, & Blessings my dearest parishioners!

As we continue our journey in this life, the Church continues to enlighten us through the Word that she received from Jesus. The readings for today focus on the sanctity of Marriage and its pivotal role in the great plan of God.

In the Gospel today, Jesus was asked by some Pharisees: "Is it lawful for a man to divorce his wife?" Jesus responded by telling them that Moses only allowed divorce because of their hardness of heart. He taught them that from the very beginning, marriage was already there in the plan of God and that the union between man L a woman by holy matrimony is indissoluble, As the marriage between Christ and the Church cannot be dissolved. Jesus clearly told us: "Even if you become unfaithful, I will still remain faithful, for I cannot deny myself. Jesus sees himself and the Church as one. In fact St. Paul tells us that Jesus is the head and we are His body, the Church, born and joined together at the foot of the Cross.

The first reading today brings us back to the story of creation, showing us that God created man and woman to be of one flesh. Eve who was taken from the side of Adam (put into deep sleep) was to be united in Adam with the bond of love. Adam sees and proclaims that Eve is "bone of his bones and flesh of his flesh. In the same way, we see Jesus, in the sleep of death on the Cross, pierced by a lance on His side. Water and Blood came gushing forth from his side (Sacrament of the baptism, which is a new birth, and the Sacrament of the Eucharist, the sacrifice that sustains life in us.)

The second reading and the Gospel continues by showing us the fruit of Marriage, the bond of love. Children, who are great gift of God and a blessing to the couple, are called to share in the glory of God as His sons and daughters.
