

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and must attend a baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - By appointment only.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

FUNERALS - Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial.

Featured Saint of the Week.

<u>Bl. Alfonso Lopez and companions, Martyrs (November 6)</u> Friars Alfonso Lopez, Modesto Vegas, Dionisio Vicente, and Pedro Rivera (all priests) and Francisco Remon and Miguel Remon (religious brothers) were members of the religious community of Granoller (Barcelona) of the Order of Friars Minor Conventual. During the summer of 1936, in the most intense period of persecution against the Church, and after the burning of the friary and the church, the above-mentioned friars gave witness to their fidelity to Christ by enduring martyrdom between July 7 and September 1 of the same year. They were beatified by Pope John Paul II March 11, 2001.

A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR.

Pax et Bonum!

My dearest brothers and sister, as we near the end of the liturgical year, the readings for this Sunday remind us again of our ultimate goal which is heaven. Four Sundays ago, the rich young man asked Jesus a very important question: "What must I do to gain eternal life?" Jesus said obey the commandments and sell all your belongings and give it to the poor.

In today's Gospel, Jesus highlights the greatest of all the commandment which summarizes everything: "The first is,

commandment which summarizes everything: "The first is, Hear, O Israel: the Lord our God is one; you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength. The second is this, You shall love your neighbour as yourself. The love of neighbour (horizontal) attached to the love of God (vertical) forms the Cross which is the symbol of the great love of God for us. Apart from the love of God, our love of neighbour will fall because it cannot stand on its own.

The triumph of Jesus on the Cross will also be our triumph if we carry our own cross. The weight of the cross will only be bearable if we put on "Christ", who is love. Paul in the second reading reminds us that Jesus is our eternal High Priest whose love lasts forever.

Let us follow the Lord unreservedly. Let us listen to Mary, the first and perfect disciple of Jesus as she invites us: "Do whatever my Son tells you to do." Let us trust the Divine Mercy of God."
