

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and must attend a baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - 15 minutes before all Weekday Masses, as well as 3:30 p.m. on Saturday; or by appointment with the priest.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - by appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

FUNERALS - Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial.

Featured Saint of the Week

St. Joseph of Cupertino, Priest (September 18)

Joseph was born in Apulia in the year 1603. As a young man he entered the Order of Friars Minor Conventual. After his ordination to the priesthood he devoted himself to the sacred ministry with great zeal for souls. He was richly blessed with favors from heaven and noted above all for his obedience, humility and patience as his superiors ordered him to various places of residence. He had a very ardent devotion to Christ in the mysteries of his life, especially the Holy Eucharist, and to the Virgin Mother of God. He died in Osimo in the year 1663

<u>A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR</u>

Peace!

Dear Brothers and sisters in Christ, as we move on with the second half of the Ordinary Time, let us try to reflect on the mind of the Church in arranging the readings of the Holy Mass, making our lives "ordered"

Jesus, in one of his discourse with an expert of the law, said that the greatest among all the commandments is : to love the Lord our God with all our heart, with all our soul, with all our being. He continued His discourse by saying that the second is not separated from this: to love your neighbour as yourself. Jesus by saying this was giving us the heart of being a Christian: the perfection of love. Learning love from God is the most important thing in life. It gives life its true purpose and meaning for we are created with love and for love. The love of neighbour complements our love for God because it is the concretization of our love for God.

The two great mysteries we celebrate (i.e. the Incarnation and the Paschal Mystery) teaches us the pure and unconditional Love of God to us. In the Ordinary Time, we are taught by Holy Mother Church how to give back that love to God through our love for our neighbours.

Since Jesus suffered and died for each one of us, everyone becomes our brother and sister to which we have the duty to love. Lovable or unlovable, friends or enemies.

This Sunday, the church, as a mother continues to guide us through the "Word of God", Jesus himself, to the love of God and our neighbour. She invites us to follow and imitate Jesus by caring for the lost sheep, by looking at them with the eyes of love, teaching them what is morally upright without judging them. On our part, since we all have our flaws, humbly also accepting the charitable correction from our brothers and sister and thanking God for showing our mistakes through the loving concern of our neighbour.

Let us remember that we can only better ourselves if we know the things we need to overcome. We need the loving concern of our brothers and sisters to grow in love.
