

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and you must attend a Baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - First Friday-(during exposition of the Blessed Sacrament), 8:30 am to 9:00 am; First Saturday – 9:30 am to 10:00 am By appointment only; Sundays – 11:30 am to 12:00 Noon, By appointment only.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

FUNERALS - Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial.

24th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Last Sunday, the 23rd Sunday of the Season, we shared about everyone's need to be healed of their hearts' deafness, which includes looking within ourselves, reflecting on our actions and thoughts in the light of Jesus' teachings, and seeking spiritual healing from God.

This Sunday's Gospel serves as a powerful reminder of the transformative nature of our Faith life, which is <u>not just a belief</u>, <u>but a call to action</u>: *"Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me" (MARK 8:34).*

WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO DENY ONESELF AND TAKE UP ONE'S CROSS?

The subsequent verse of the GOSPEL clarifies: For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and that of the gospel will save it" (MARK 8:35). Here, Jesus (the true savior) meant the act of identifying with our Lord and putting others before ourselves. Without the works that stem from such a commitment, if we cling to others, such as ourselves or wealth, "our faith" is dead. The self-giving works that emanate from a genuine following of Jesus are the living proof of a vibrant faith.

WHAT IS THE RELATIONSHIP OF A LIFE-GIVING FAITH AND ONE'S WORKS OF CHARITY? St. James is well aware that **proper conduct can only come with an authentic faith commitment to God** (JAMES 2:18 & 26). St. Paul, too, understands the implications of true faith for a life of love and generosity (see GALATIANS 5:6,13–15). Also, he insisted that such <u>works are</u> <u>essential to the authentic life of faith</u> (ROMANS chapters 12-14) which are all about the Christian obligation to exercise one's gifts for the building up of the community. **Our deeds of charity are the implementation of God's mandate to love one's neighbor.**



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
