

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and must attend a baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - 15 minutes before all Weekday Masses, as well as 3:30 p.m. on Saturday; or by appointment with the priest.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING -

by appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

Featured Saint of the Week

St. Andrew Kim Tae-gon, Priest, & Paul Chong Ha-sang, and Companions, Martyrs

St. Andrew (d. 1846) was born in Seoul to converts to the Faith. He travelled 1300 miles to the nearest seminary in South China to become the first native Korean priest. He was tortured and beheaded along with his lay associate, St. Paul (1795-1839); between 1839-1867, 103 Korean martyrs gave their lives for the Faith.

A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Peace and Goodness!

We continue to pray for the safety of all our parishioners, relatives, friends, and benefactors especially in this time of pandemic. May the BVM cover all of us with the mantle of her maternal protection.

The Gospel this Sunday gives us the parable of Jesus about the Kingdom of God. It shows the unlimited generosity of God to all who connects with Him. It has nothing to do with reciprocating what we do for Him. It all starts with Him. He is the first to love. He invites us to "work in His vineyard" because by doing so, we can open to allow him to enter into our lives. Looking closely at the parable, we realize that God's generosity is not conditioned by our generosity to work (in love) at the vineyard of the Lord. The first to be called by the landowner missed the point by looking on themselves. After all even the capacity to work which is a sharing in the creative power of God which in God is an act of love is all a gift from God who is the source of all that is good.

The parable this Sunday teaches us a lot of things:

- Work is sacred because it is a participation in the creative power of God as His children and it should be always done in charity as service for brothers and sisters.
- That as God, our Father is generous, so we should also be generous towards our brothers and sisters as with the early Christian community.
- That as long as we connect with God through Jesus in the Sacraments, we will be sustained by God's generosity and grow in the love of the Lord.

As the Gospel highlights, God is still out calling at the last hour. Let us respond to the invitation of Christ and enter the vineyard of the Lord. Let us find Him where He could still be found. The real joy of life is finding and having Jesus in our lives. It is the pearl of great prize. With Jesus, life is worth living because He gives true meaning to our lives.
