

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and you must attend a Baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - First Friday-(during exposition of the Blessed Sacrament), 8:30 am to 9:00 am; First Saturday – 9:30 am to 10:00 am By appointment only; Sundays – 11:30 am to 12:00 Noon, By appointment only.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

FUNERALS - Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial.

25th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Last Sunday, we heard of Jesus' invitation: "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me" (Mark 8:34). To be with our Savior is to profess FAITH, which finds expression in our deeds of charity toward our neighbors according to the Father's command to selfless love.

This Sunday, once again, we are called to remember the ultimate sacrifice and resurrection of Jesus: *"Take up [the] cross, follow me." He who is the Christ. He must suffer greatly, be rejected and killed, and then rise after three days.* This is the core of our Christian faith, the foundation on which we build our lives.

ARE WE WILLING TO LIVE THE LIFE OF CHRIST? Brothers and sisters, let us be steadfast as we remember the words of the FIRST READING: The <u>righteous one</u> who is faithful will suffer at the hands of the wicked. Nonetheless, God will <u>take care of him</u>. God did not save Jesus from suffering and death at the hands of those who rejected his teaching, but God did raise Jesus to a new life. God does <u>take care</u> <u>of</u> those who are faithful.

Consider the Psalms used today and realize that the Lord God upholds our lives: "O God, by your name, save me, and defend my cause. O God, hear my prayer." Let us proclaim to everyone: "God is my helper; the Lord sustains my life. Freely will I offer you sacrifice; I will praise your name, O LORD, for its goodness."

LET US strives for greater awareness in recognizing common humanitv and our accompanying another life's one along journey. Also, for greater recognition of the harm happening to the earth, all world leaders and each of us may take meaningful steps to curtail the environmental damage of the planet and work to protect all people, especially the poor and vulnerable. from its effects.



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
