

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and you must attend a Baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - First Friday-(during exposition of the Blessed Sacrament), 8:30 am to 9:00 am; First Saturday – 9:30 am to 10:00 am By appointment only; Sundays – 11:30 am to 12:00 Noon, By appointment only.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

FUNERALS - Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial.

From the PASTOR's Office

Our Parish community has a long history of welcoming Migrants and Refugees; ministering and journeying with many were considered by many as essential and worthwhile moments of their faith-witnessing. Unfortunately, this endeavor has stopped a few years ago and is now nonexistent.

We know what caused this situation —many stories were re-told to explain why it happened and so people are hesitant to try again for fear of falling into the same challenges while some now limit themselves in privately helping *some migrants or refugees.*

How about you and others? Let us take courage and band together to revive the ministry. Yes, our parish still have those few who assist them through our collaboration with St. Vincent de Paul's, but still, fewer are those who spent time with them. It is time to be out there ---with them!

On September 24th, we marked again the WORLD DAY FOR MIGRANTS AND REFUGEES. It is an occasion for us, as part of the Catholic Church, to reflect on the situation of migrant and refugee families in our midst. Many were forced to flee their homes due to violence, persecution, or discrimination. Let us consider the challenges they face, such as being separated from their families and adapting to the new culture here in Canada.

Are we still sensitive to the plight of these families? Do we offer them our understanding and hospitality? Jesus invites us to open our hearts and overcome our fears and prejudices, to welcome, know, and acknowledge them, and to understand their hopes, potential, fears, and weaknesses. Let us take every opportunity to approach and be with them as brothers and sisters in GOD, the provident Father of all.
