

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and must attend a baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - 15 minutes before all Weekday Masses, as well as 3:30 p.m. on Saturday; or by appointment with the priest.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - by appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

FUNERALS - Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial.

Featured Saint of the Week.

<u>St. Lorenzo Ruiz de Manila & Companions, Martyrs (Sept. 28)</u> St. Lawrence (d. 1630) was a devoted husband and father of three in the Philippines. After having been wrongfully accused of murder, he fled with Christian missionaries to Japan where he was tortured and killed for the Faith. He died professing, "I shall die for God, and for Him I would give many thousands of lives if I had them."

<u>A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR</u>

Peace and joy!

In the second reading, St. Paul gives us the background in understanding the Gospel message: (Jesus) though He was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God something to be grasped. Rather, He emptied Himself taking the form of the slave, coming in human likeness...He humbled Himself, becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on the cross.

Here, St. Paul shows the tremendous love of God which no human mind could fully comprehend. He invites us to have the same attitude with Christ, to love as Jesus loves, to suffer as Jesus sufferred for the love of God and our neighbour.

In the Gospel, Jesus presents to us the "parable of the two sons". It is beautiful to note that Jesus, presents the first (tax collectors and prostitutes) and the second (chief priests and the elders) as both sons. As sons, both are invited to work in the vineyard of the Father, one said yes but did not do it, the other said no but did it.

As Baptized Catholic Christians, we are made sons and daughters of the Father, and we are called to work in the vineyard of the Lord. The Gospel for today invites us to reexamine our lives to see if there are discrepancies between what we profess and the manner of life we live. We can only be true sons and daughters of our Father in heaven if we do the will of our heavenly Father as what Jesus said: "Who are my mother, my brothers and sisters? ... they are the ones who does the will of my Father in heaven.

Let us listen to the words of Mary, our mother at Cana: "Do whatever my Son tells you to do." Let us open our hearts and listen to God!
