

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and you must attend a Baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - By appointment only.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

FUNERALS - Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial.

From the PASTOR'S office

St. Michael the Archangel is one of the three angels mentioned in the Scriptures, the others being St. Raphael and St. Gabriel. We can find in these references St. Michael: as one of the "chief princes" who engage in a battle to aid in victory for God's elect (Daniel 10:13- 21 and 12:1); it is he who contends with the devil, disputing over the body of Moses, not speaking a reviling word against him but simply saying "The Lord rebuke you!" (Jude 5:9); and then the most dramatic is in that great battle in Heaven, when the wicked angels under Lucifer revolt against God, and how Michael, leading the faithful angels, defeats the hosts of evil and drives them out (Revelation 12:7-9). Because of this victory, St. Michael is revered in Catholic tradition as the protector of the Church, with a liturgical feast every September 29.

Saint Michael the Archangel is not a saint but an angel who is the leader of all angels and the commander of God's army. This function is what the title *"Archangel"* denotes that he is superior to all others in terms of authority and has four primary obligations, which are:

- 1. Combating Satan.
- 2. Escorting the faithful to paradise at the hour of their death.
- 3. As the defender of all Christians and the Church herself.
- 4. The one to summon humanity from their earthly existence to their divine judgment.

Let us pray sincerely this prayer (originated with Pope Leo XIII in 1886):

Saint Michael Archangel, defend us in battle, be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil; may God rebuke him, we humbly pray, and do thou, O Prince of the heavenly host, by God's power, cast into hell Satan and all the evil spirits who prowl through the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen.
