

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and you must attend a Baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - First Friday-(during exposition of the Blessed Sacrament), 8:30 am to 9:00 am; First Saturday – 9:30 am to 10:00 am By appointment only; Sundays – 11:30 am to 12:00 Noon, By appointment only.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

FUNERALS - Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial.

22nd & 23rd SUNDAYs in Ordinary Time

In the last Sunday's Gospel, we see the Pharisees' attention to external acts and behavior, such as the ritual cleaning of hands. Jesus, in turn, points out that rather than these external rituals, having a pure heart is more important. It is inner purity that results in outward behavior that matters: "There is nothing outside a person that by going in can defile them, but the things that come out of a person are what defile them. From within people, from their hearts, come evil thoughts" (Mark 7:15, 20, 21).

HOW TO HAVE A PURE HEART? The answer lies somewhat in today's Gospel We need to come to Jesus and be healed of our hearts' deafness. This requires us to look within, reflect on our actions and thoughts, and seek spiritual healing. It also demands introspection, reflection on our actions and thoughts, and a deliberate pursuit of spiritual healing.

Pope Francis has this to say: "We all have ears, but very often we cannot hear. Why is this? There is interior deafness, which is worse than physical deafness because it is the deafness of the heart. Taken up with haste by so many things to say and do, we do not find time to stop and listen to those who speak to us. We risk becoming impervious to everything and not making room for those who need to be heard. I am thinking about children, young people, the elderly, and the many who do not need words and sermons but to be heard. Let us ask ourselves: how is my capacity to listen going? Do I let myself be touched by people's lives? But if we dedicate ourselves to the Gospel, we will find the secret to our spiritual health. This is the medicine: a little silence and listening every day. Today, as on the day of our Baptism, we hear the words of Jesus addessed to us: "Ephphatha, be opened!" Open our ears (Pope Francis' Angelus - September 5, 2021).

LET US ASK JESUS TO "OPEN" OUR HEART AND ENABLE US TO FULLY LIVE OUR RELATIONSHIP WITH GOD AND WITH OTHERS.



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
