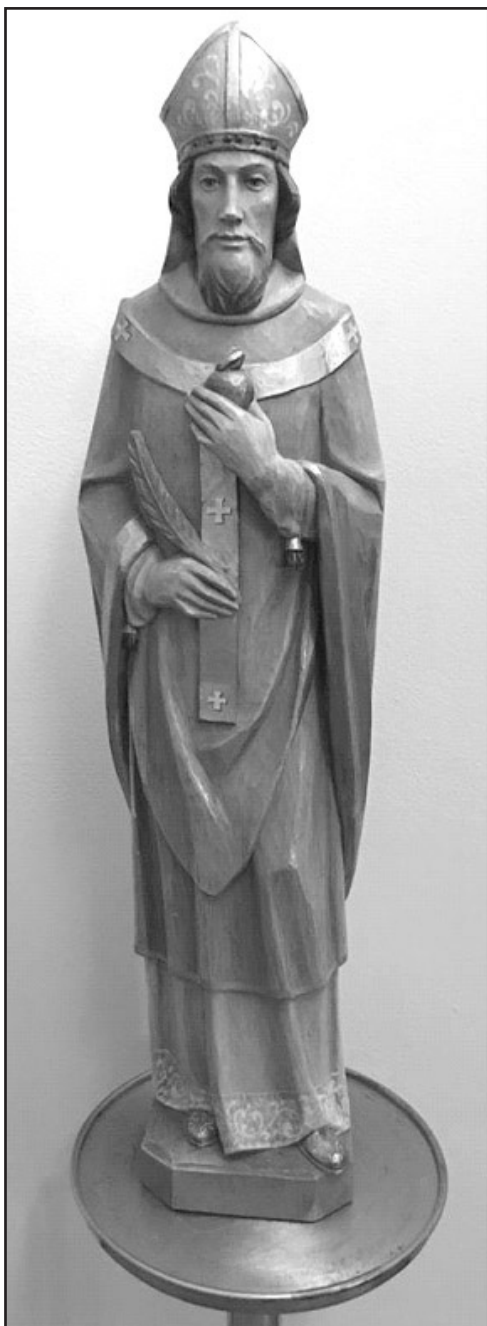

**THE MONTH OF THE HOLY ROSARY**

**When is the Month of the Holy Rosary 2024?**

The month of the Holy Rosary in 2024 begins on Saturday, October 1<sup>st</sup> and ends on Monday, October 31<sup>st</sup>.

**What are the origins of the Month of the Holy Rosary?**

The main reason why the Month of the Holy Rosary takes place in October is because the Catholic liturgical "Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary" occurs on October 7<sup>th</sup> each year. This marks the moment when the Rosary was established. In an apparition, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to give the Rosary to a young priest named Dominic de Guzmán (later becoming a Saint) in order to help him continue his mission of converting people to Catholicism.

**What is the Month of the Holy Rosary?**

The Month of the Holy Rosary is a special time dedicated to praying the Rosary. The Rosary is an important set of prayers for Catholics, but can also be used by all Christians. Rosary beads are often used for protection, and many people believe that having a rosary with them will keep evil and danger away.

**Did you know?**

The word "Rosary" translates to "Crown of Roses." Roses can signify many sentiments, but historically, they are considered a timeless and beautiful flower. It is believed that each time the Holy Rosary is recited, a crown of roses is placed upon the heads of the Blessed Mother and Jesus, which will never disappear.
