Envelopes

There are folks who are using envelopes that are labelled for the parish or sharing God's gifts for mass intentions. This causes confusion for the counters. Use the envelopes marked clearly Mass Intentions. They are high-lighted with a yellow stripe. If you want to use a plain white envelope, that would be alright.

Baptism not birthday!

For some strange reason there are many who are waiting an entire year prior to having their baby baptized. I thought that this might be a cultural thing, however, in checking with our Filipino priests I am told otherwise. It would seem that this phenomena has appeared in Canada in order to save money and celebrate the baptism with the first birthday. This practice needs to stop. Baptism should take precedence and should take place within the first few weeks after birth. Also, waiting for an entire year often makes the actual baptism more difficult. By the age of one the child knows that something out of the ordinary is happening and the child usually will resist and begin flailing in the parent's arms. This makes it difficult to baptize. A baby doesn't do this. To get to the point, have your baby baptized within the first few weeks after birth.


