Ash Wednesday March 5, 2025 Our parish has 2 masses: 9:00 am and 7:00 pm

Ash Wednesday is one of the most popular and important holy days in the liturgical calendar. Ash Wednesday opens Lent, a season of fasting and prayer. For members of the Latin Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 to age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal. The practice includes the wearing of ashes on the head. The ashes symbolize the dust from which God made us. As the priest applies the ashes to a person's forehead, he speaks the words: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

During Lenten season, Stations of the Cross will be offered on Friday at 6:30 followed by Mass at 7:00 pm
