DEVELOPMENT & PEACE –Reaping Our Rights Campaign- Defending Peasants Rights- Although they feed the world and care for the Earth, peasant and rural communities around the world often live precariously and face many challenges. Undaunted, they organize and advocate for their rights. It was their courageous mobilization that led to the adoption of the *United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Peasants and Other People Working in Rural Areas* (UNDROP).

What is UNDROP? Adopted on December 17, 2018, the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Peasants and other People Working in Rural Areas is a major victory for the peasant movements around the world. It was drafted by and for peasants to protect their rights. With the Reaping Our Rights Campaign, we will learn what UNDROP is all about and stand in solidarity with peasants and small-scale farmers. We will help ensure that their rights are respected by pushing for the adoption of effective due diligence legislation. Such a law would compel Canadian companies to respect the environment and human rights across their global supply chains.
