CHRISTMAS MASS TIMES

We do our best to provide Mass times that meet the needs of our parishioners adequately. This year, we will follow the same schedule as last year.

If you are hoping to attend a prayerful liturgy with a smaller crowd, we would encourage you to avoid the 5:00 p.m. Mass, which is usually the most "chaotic." If you don't mind large crowds with lots of holy noise, this mass will work for you. If you want a seat at this Mass, you will need to come early. Pews are filled on a first come first served basis, so if you want your family to join you, they will need to arrive with you.

If you prefer a more solemn liturgy, we would suggest either the 8:00 p.m., Midnight or Christmas morning, 10:00 a.m. Mass. The most solemn liturgy will be the 12:00 Solemn Midnight Mass. All will be celebrated, however, with joy.

OPENING OF THE JUBILEE YEAR, 2025 AND THE CONSECRATION OF FAMILIES

Next weekend at all the Masses our parish will celebrate the annual Consecration of Families sponsored by our parish Knights of Columbus Council.

We will also be officially beginning the opening of the Jubilee Year in our Parish Community. The theme of this Jubilee Year is Pilgrims of Hope. The 2025 Jubilee Year, also known as a Holy Year, is a significant event in the Catholic Church, celebrated every 25 years. Here are some key points about its significance:

The Jubilee begins with the opening of the Holy Door at St. Peter's Basilica on December 24, 2024. Holy Doors at other major basilicas in Rome will also be opened, symbolizing the passage to salvation. In the Diocese of Hamilton, the Year will be promulgated in all parishes in the Diocese.

The concept of Jubilee originates from the Old Testament, where every 50th year was designated as a time of forgiveness of debts, liberation of slaves, and return of lands to their original owners. The first Christian Jubilee was proclaimed in 1300 by Pope Boniface VIII. Since then, it has been celebrated every 25 years, with some extraordinary Jubilees declared for special occasions.

Millions of pilgrims are expected to visit Rome, participating in acts of devotion, receiving sacraments, and performing works of mercy. There are Church sites designated throughout the Diocese of Hamilton for this purpose for those who are not able to travel to Rome.

The Church offers special opportunities for obtaining indulgences during the Jubilee Year, emphasizing the remission of temporal punishment for sins that have already been forgiven.

The Jubilee aims to foster peace and unity in a world facing various challenges, including climate change and global conflicts. The event also serves as a time for cultural and social renewal, encouraging the faithful to reflect on their relationship with God, each other, and creation.

The 2025 Jubilee Year is a profound period for spiritual growth, reflection, and communal rejuvenation, offering a unique opportunity for Catholics worldwide to deepen their faith and hope.
