

It will help me and my staff if emails are directed to the person who can best address your issue. The parish secretary best handles some things, others by our Youth Minister and others should be directed to the pastor.

For reasons of confidentiality and to speed up the response, please do not send requests for appointments with me through the parish email address or the parish secretary. It makes extra work for our parish secretary and she is not in the office on weekends or on Monday, I do not access or monitor the parish email address.

Phone messages for me can be left in my mailbox For medical emergencies, please use the emergency contact number on the front of the bulletin. If your call is not answered immediately, please leave a message and I will get back to you as soon as possible, usually within 15 minutes. Please do not use this number for ordinary pastoral inquiries. Following these procedures will ensure your enquiries are handled as quickly as possible.

THE IMPORTANCE OF REGISTERING IN THE PARISH

Officially registering in the parish continues to be an important component of establishing or maintaining a formal connection with the parish. Even if you don't attend regularly, please register. This is particularly important if you attend this parish but reside outside of our parish boundaries, which are: Northern Boundary: Old Plains Rd. East; Eastern Boundary: West Side of Maple Avenue; Southern Boundary Northshore Blvd and Lakeshore Rd.; Western Boundary: End of Plains Rd. W. Registration is essential if you attend here and live outside the parish boundaries, because it establishes a formal connection with this parish community.

We highly encourage all persons who regularly attend Holy Rosary Parish to fill out a registration form so that our records and parish census is up to date. All people who live in the household should be included on the registration form. Registration helps us to determine where sacraments such as baptism, first communion, confirmation and marriage are celebrated. Current registration is important to determine the proper parish for the celebration of weddings, funerals and the sacraments and is necessary for anyone who requests a pastoral reference.

Your cooperation is greatly appreciated. Registration forms are available in the entrance to the church and can be placed in the collection basket when filled out or handed to the priest.

A PASTORAL NOTE ABOUT ARRANGING FUNERALS

In recent years a trend has developed in which funeral homes call the parish after meeting with family members to inform us about plans for the funeral celebration, such as the date and time, where the funeral will be held and other decisions that are best dealt with by the family in consultation with the pastor. When this happens, we lose a crucial opportunity to connect with the family, discuss their options around Christian burial and make informed and appropriate pastoral decisions that serve the family well. The first person to contact to arrange a funeral should be the parish priest.

Please be aware that the pastoral preference is to hold funerals in the Church, rather than the funeral home, unless there are extraordinary reasons as to why a funeral home service is preferred. There are pastoral and liturgical options that we can discuss with the family prior to meeting with the funeral director. Celebrating the funeral liturgy in the Church enables us to have a more dignified and prayerful celebration which may take place within the celebration of mass or in a funeral liturgy without mass, depending on the circumstances and comfort level of the mourners. These decisions need to be made in consultation with the pastor to ensure that the family is properly educated about the funeral rites that are designed to help them grieve properly in the context of a believing community.
