# Pastoral Care of the Sick and Homebound



## THE SOLEMNITY OF CHRIST THE KING

The Solemnity of Christ the King replaces the last Sunday in Ordinary Time. This Solemnity honours Jesus Christ as Lord over all creation. Essentially a magnification of the Feast of the Ascension, it was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925. Initially, it was celebrated on the last Sunday in October. Still, in the revised liturgical calendar promulgated by Pope Paul VI in 1969, it was moved to the last Sunday of Ordinary Time (immediately preceding Advent), where its theme of Christ's dominion made it a fitting end to the liturgical year.

## ADVENT BEGINS NEXT SUNDAY

The word **Advent** means "coming" or "arrival." The focus of the entire season is the celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ in his First Advent and the anticipation of the return of Christ the King in his Second Advent. Thus, Advent is far more than simply marking a 2,000-year-old historical event. It is celebrating a truth about God, the revelation of God in Christ, whereby all of creation will be reconciled to God. Scripture readings for Advent will reflect this emphasis on the Second Advent, including themes of accountability for faithfulness at His coming, judgment on sin, and the hope of eternal life.

In this double focus on past and future, Advent also symbolizes the spiritual journey of individuals and a congregation, as they affirm that Christ has come, that He is present in the world today, and that He will come again in power.

Advent is marked by a spirit of expectation, anticipation, preparation, longing, and hope. This hope, however faint at times, brings to the world the anticipation of a King who will rule with truth and justice and righteousness over His people and in His creation. Come, Lord Jesus!

#### **REGISTRATION FOR KINDEGARTEN AT HCDSB.**

Kindergarten registration at the Halton Catholic District School Board (HCDSB) for the 2025-2026 school year is now open!

The HCDSB's admissions policy respects the constitutional rights of Catholic ratepayers to maintain the Catholicity of our elementary schools. All children enrolled in the Catholic school system at the elementary level are required to be baptized in Latin Rite or Eastern Rite Catholic baptism. For children not baptized Catholic, one parent must be Catholic and willing to take responsibility for raising the child in the Catholic faith.

Children of non-Catholic parents may contact the parish priest to discuss what is needed to baptize their children. However, please be respectfully advised that we cannot baptize simply to enroll a child in the Catholic school system. All the requirements for the baptism of children in the Catholic faith apply.
