## THE IMPORTANCE OF REGISTERING IN THE PARISH

#### Please Help us Update our Records!

Officially registering in the parish continues to be an important component of establishing or maintaining a formal connection with the parish. Even if you don't attend regularly, please register. This is particularly important if you attend this parish but reside outside of our parish boundaries, which are: Northern Boundary: Old Plains Rd. East; Eastern Boundary: West Side of Maple Avenue; Southern Boundary Northshore Blvd and Lakeshore Rd.; Western Boundary: End of Plains Rd. W.

We highly encourage all persons who regularly attend Holy Rosary Parish to fill out a registration form so that our records and parish census is up to date. All people who live in the household should be included on the registration form. Registration helps us to determine where sacraments such as baptism, first communion, confirmation and marriage are celebrated. Current registration is important to determine the proper parish for the celebration of funerals and is necessary for anyone who requests a pastoral reference

Although the use of parish envelopes or pre-authorized debiting to support the work of the parish is very much appreciated (and needed!) There is no obligation to used envelopes or to donate to the parish.

Your cooperation is greatly appreciated. Registration forms are available in the entrance to the church and can be placed in the collection basket when filled out or handed to the priest.

We will also have a discussion about future members or participants in the Pastoral Advisory Council. This meeting will be held on **Tuesday**, **October 29**, **2024 from 7:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. in the Parish Centre.** 

#### DID YOU KNOW THAT 2025 IS A HOLY YEAR?

In 2025 the universal Church will celebrate a **Jubilee Year** – a year of renewal in faith. The theme of the year established by Pope Francis is "*Pilgrims of Hope*". Pope Francis has asked that the Jubilee be marked in a particular way by rediscovering the teachings of Vatican II, in particular the four Constitutions, and by prayer.

The Diocese of Hamilton has developed a 5 Session Video Series on the Second Vatican Council and formed a study guide around the four major documents of the Second Vatican Council: *The Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy* (Sacrosanctum Concilium), *The Dogmatic Constitution on the Church (Lumen Gentium), The Constitution on Divine Revelation (Dei Verbum) and the Pastoral Constitution on the Church in the Modern World (Gaudium et Spes).* The material can be viewed on the Diocesan website <u>https://hamiltondiocese.com/vatican-ii/</u> These are extraordinary documents and are crucial to understanding the intent of hopes of he Second Vatican Council.

If anyone is interested in studying these documents, I would be willing to form a study group in the parish. I invite you to look at the material and see if it is something that might interest you and let the pastor know if you are interested.
