For centuries, God's people have honoured and prayed for the dead in November, and especially on November 2<sup>nd</sup>, All Souls' Day---a day to think of all those who have died, known and unknown,

to commend them into the arms of the Heavenly Father, that they might be with him forever. It is also recommended to visit cemeteries on or about November 2nd. Prayer for the dead is particularly powerful in November. Plenary Indulgences can be obtained, to be applied to the Souls in Purgatory, by reciting the Lord's Prayer and Hail Mary in church, at a cemetery, or even at home. A worthy personal disposition is required, including Confession and Communion. OUR MONTHLY ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT FOR NOVEMBER WILL BE ON ALL SAINT'S DAY, FROM 8:30 A.M. TO 12;00 NOON. Father Wilhelm will be available for Reconciliation from 11:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.



We invite our parishioners and visitors to sign the names of all relatives and friends, who have died, into the BOOK OF LIFE. The book will be at the front of the Church, near the Baptismal Font and the Easter Candle; it will remain there during the

month of November, reminding us to pray for our departed loved ones. Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace.

I wish to bring together the Pastoral Council to listen to one another and share with each other some of the possibilities for the further development of the pastoral and spiritual vision of the parish. We will also have a discussion about future members or participants on the Pastoral Advisory Council. This meeting will be held on **Tuesday**, **October 29**, **2024 from 7:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. in the Parish Centre.** 

#### DID YOU KNOW THAT 2025 IS A HOLY YEAR?

In 2025 the universal Church will celebrate a **Jubilee Year** – a year of renewal in faith. The theme of the year established by Pope Francis is "*Pilgrims of Hope*". Pope Francis has asked that the Jubilee be marked in a particular way by rediscovering the teachings of Vatican II, in particular the four Constitutions, and by prayer. The Diocese of Hamilton has developed a 5 Session Video Series on the Second Vatican Council and formed a study guide around the four major documents of the Second Vatican Council: *The Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy* (*Sacrosanctum Concilium*), *The Dogmatic Constitution on the Church (Lumen Gentium), The Constitution on Divine Revelation (Dei Verbum) and the Pastoral Constitution on the Church in the Modern World (Gaudium et Spes)*. The material can be viewed on the Diocesan website <u>https://hamiltondiocese.com/vatican-ii/</u> These are extraordinary documents and are crucial to understanding the intent of hopes of he Second Vatican Council.

The Communal Spiritual Growth group in our parish is beginning the study of these documents. They meet once per month on Monday evenings at 7:00 p.m. Their first session will begin on November 18. We highly recommend that parishioners take a look at this material and consider participation in this very worthwhile review of these incredible documents.
