

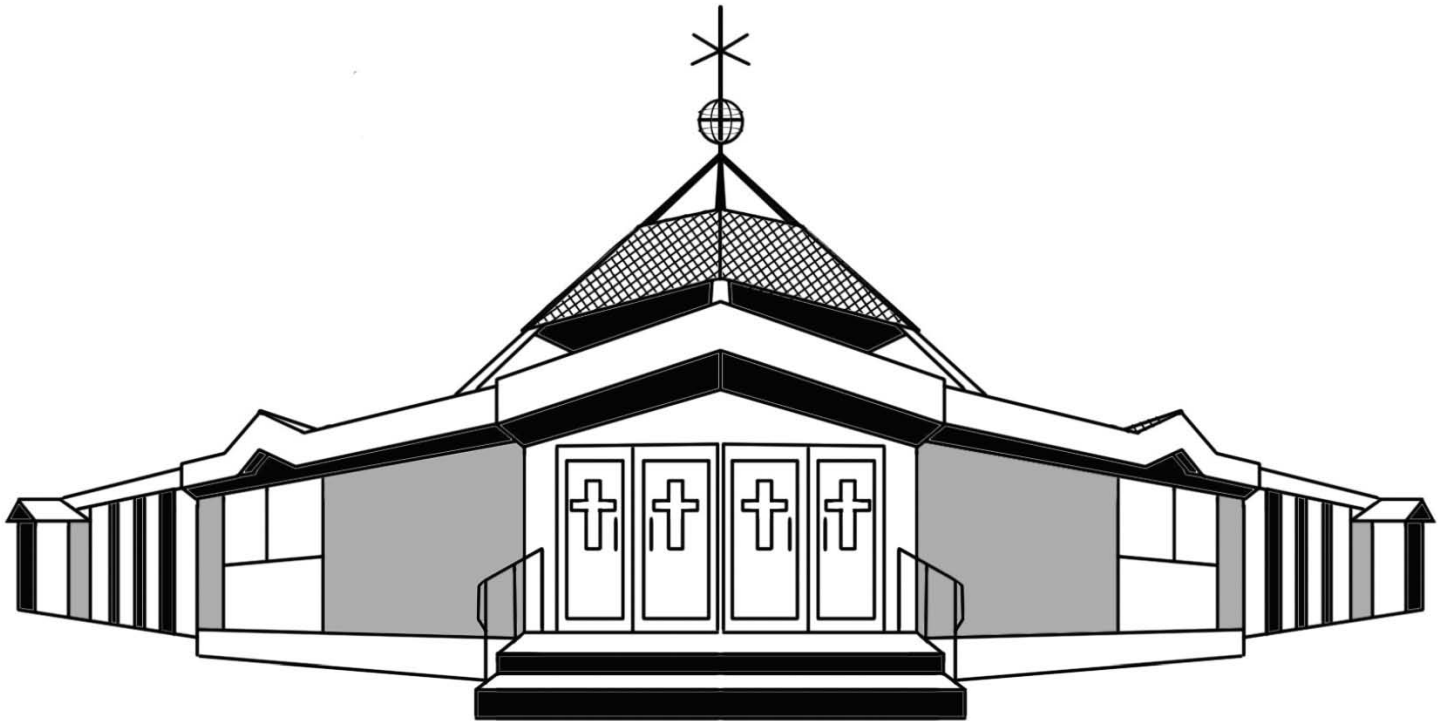

Lenten Prayer to Deliver Us From Consumerism

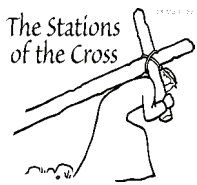


Pope Francis described consumerism as "a virus that attacks the faith at the roots", because it makes us believe that life depends only on what we have, so we forget about God.
