

## Living Biblically

Dear Parishioners:

I must confess that Monday at 9:30 pm I have been following a new comedy program on CBS, Living Biblically. Do I watch it to feed my soul for knowledge of God's ways? No, scripture and tradition remain for me the foundation for knowledge and understanding in the ways of the Lord. However, the show is a lighthearted, innocuous comedy that follows the main character, Chip Curry, a lapsed Catholic, who decides to follow the Bible 100%. After the death of his good friend and with a child that he and his wife are expecting, Chip decides to live a meaningful and faithfilled life. To help him along the way, he seeks advice from his Priest and the Priest's friend, a Rabbi - his "God Squad." Chip will come to realize that there are many aspects of the Law that need proper understanding and interpretation. So for example, the prohibition of wearing garments sewed from mixed fabrics (Leviticus 19:19), is not such a priority as honouring ones' parents, telling the truth and loving one's neighbour.

While the show steers from controversy like abortion and euthanasia, one thing I do appreciate is the positive portrayal of religion. TV is filled with countless images of religion as being the panacea for the ignorant, the narrow-minded and the deranged zealot. *Living Biblically* portrays ordinary, regular folks trying to live meaningful lives through different challenges and obstacles. The show may not win over new adherents or influence more positive portrayal of religion in entertainment; nevertheless, at least for that brief half hour on prime time one does not have to cringe or get upset, but enjoy a light-hearted comedy with religion refreshingly seen as a force for good.
