

Dear Parishioners:

This week will mark another exciting time for the life of the Parish: Vacation Bible School or Camp for children between the ages of 5-12. This year's theme will be *The Sky's the Limit – with God all things are possible!* This will be the second time that such a program will be offered at Blessed Sacrament. A number of other churches in the area have offered this program year to year, but it is wonderful to see that we will be offering a Catholic summer program. This will allow the children a beautiful experience of community and faith.

Such a program could not be possible without the support of the parents and their children. We have tried to encourage as many families as possible by offering a low-cost, half day camp experience. As parents know, other camp programs can run upwards of \$300 or more for the entire week. We have only asked for \$25 for the entire week, plus a family rate for 3 or more children.

We must also be thankful for the numerous volunteers who have offered their services. Without their dedication and care, this program could not be possible.
