



"Lord, to whom can we go? You have the words of eternal life".

These words of St. Peter encapsulate for us the main thrust of today's gospel reading. We have been reflecting on the "Bread of Life" discourse (John 6) offered by Jesus these past four Sundays. Today we read the end of chapter 6. It is in some ways anticlimactic. The chapter began with Jesus miraculously multiplying the barley loaves and two fish to feed the crowd. The crowd was so impressed that they were prepared to make Jesus their king, right then and there.

Jesus wisely avoids such a hasty plan. He must explain to them first what they had just witnessed. He did not perform the miracle to simply fill their bellies. He wanted them to see that beyond their physical needs, they had a deep spiritual longing for truth, light, hope and salvation. So Jesus explains to them how he offers them the Bread of Life, through the Eucharist and his teaching and wisdom.

He finally declares to his disciples, "Unless you eat of the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you." Jesus is telling his disciples that in order to follow him, we must surrender ourselves completely to him. His way must be our way, total and complete. We must fully consume his teaching, wisdom and morals in order to be true disciples of Christ. Many were incapable of accepting that and so they abandoned Jesus. Perhaps they thought they needed to follow Jesus' teaching only when it suited their needs and/or agenda. For Jesus, there is no compromise or middle ground. We must be "all in" in order to receive his life-giving grace.

Let us pray that we may have the strength and courage to follow Jesus and surrender our will to him so that we can truly partake of the Bread of Life that nourishes us with fullness of life and everlasting life.
