

**49 NEWCOMERS WERE WELCOMED TO CANADA IN JULY** through the BVOR program and sponsorship agreements arranged by the Diocesan Office of Refugees! This is the largest number of refugees welcomed by the Office in any month this year – in fact, ever! A mother and son arrived in Canada to reunite with their husband/father after 10 years of separation. A family of five arrived after waiting for their case to be processed since 2012 and St. Patrick Parish, Burlington, welcomed an Eritrean family of 5.

### SPEAKING OUT: THE DANGERS OF GOSSIP

Dear Parishioners,

A young writer from the Catholic Register, Elizabeth Chelmecki, wrote a thought provoking article on the dangers of gossip in our time. Gossip is not new but with the avalanche of celebrity tabloids, reality TV, and social media, it becomes ever more pervasive, intrusive and even destructive in our lives.

There seems to be something about listening and sharing gossip that feels so satisfying. It makes us feel entertained, validated, superior and included.

I must admit that I have been an active participant in this culture. I would listen and share news with my friends, factual or not. And I can say that I have been on the receiving end as well.

Pope Francis accurately called gossip a form of murder. He said when we use our words to spread hateful things about other people, we are also ruining the image of God in that person. Gossiping is usually accompanied by hypocrisy and is divisive because it ruins peace and unity within our communities.

I recall the late great Cardinal Joseph Bernardin of Chicago writing in his autobiography shortly before dying how the false accusation and innuendo of clergy abuse allegedly committed by him (of which he was totally exonerated), caused him greater pain and suffering than the onslaught of pancreatic cancer which eventually took his life. A dying man's view on gossip clearly validates the Pope's description of gossip as murder and challenges us to see the destructiveness that it brings into our lives.
