
**St. Stephen** 

St. Stephen, died 36 CE, Jerusalem; feast day December 26<sup>th</sup>, Christian deacon in Jerusalem and the first Christian martyr, whose apology before the Sanhedrin (Acts of the Apostles 7) points to a distinct strand of belief in early Christianity. His

defense of his faith before the rabbinic court enraged his Jewish audience, and he was taken out of the city and stoned to death. His final words, a prayer of forgiveness for his attackers (Acts of the Apostles 7:60), echo those of Jesus on the cross (Luke 23:34). Stephen is the Patron Saint of Deacons and stonemasons. His feast day is observed with both religious and secular traditions in a number of countries which is recognized on December 26<sup>th</sup>.

#### St. John



Christian tradition says that John the Evangelist was **John the Apostle**. The Apostle John

**December 27th** 

was one of the "pillars" of the Jerusalem church after Jesus' death. He was one of the original twelve apostles and is thought to be the only one to have not been killed for his faith. In the Gospel of John, the phrase "the disciple whom Jesus loved," or "the Beloved Disciple" is used five times, but is not used in any other New Testament accounts of Jesus. St. John is called the Apostle of Charity, a virtue he had learned from his Divine Master, and which he constantly instilled by word and example. The "beloved disciple" died in Ephesus after AD 98, where a stately church was erected over his tomb. It was afterwards converted into a Mohammedan mosque. St. John is the patron saint of love, loyalty, friendships, and authors. He is often depicted in art as the author of the Gospel with an eagle, symbolizing "the height he rose to in his gospel." In other icons, he is shown looking up into heaven and dictating his Gospel to his disciple. St. John, Apostle and Evangelist's feast day is celebrated on December 27th.



The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph was a **human family** with a mother, a father and a child, and they faced many challenges. Families today continue to be God's masterpiece and
