

Our Blessed Mother Mary and the Advent Promise



Dear Parishioners:

Throughout the Advent season we are introduced to key Advent figures who model for us the way to prepare for the Lord's coming, such as, the Prophet Isaiah, St. John the Baptist, St. Joseph, and of course, Mary our Blessed Mother. A wise Priest from my seminary days often would say "Nobody better prepared for Christmas than our Blessed Mother!" And how true!

During the Advent season we read about how Mary was chosen to be the Mother of our Lord (4th Sunday of Advent). We read about the revelation received by our Blessed Mother from the Angel Gabriel: "You have found favour with God. And now you will conceive in your womb and bear a son; therefore, the child to be born will be called the Son of God." Mary demonstrated obedience and complete trust in God. In time, Joseph would become a loyal servant and protector of the Holy Family.

Aside from this pivotal passage of the Advent season, we celebrate two important Feast days in honour of our Blessed Mother: the Immaculate Conception (December 8) and Our Lady of Guadalupe (December 12). These devotions give us a glimpse into the soul of our Blessed Mother and her deep abiding faith. As we look to Mary for hope and inspiration, she gently turns our attention to her beloved Son and Saviour, Jesus Christ. Through her example, may we better understand God's loving plan and promise for us.
