

# Healthy Use of Information Technology



**Dear Parishioners:** 

I recall a Professor of ethics once said to us, "Technology can be a good thing or a bad thing. It can give us greater freedom and access or it can enslave us and harm our humanity." More than ever, we need the wisdom and guidance on how to use information technology and social media for the betterment of humanity and not its destruction.

Sadly, we see the destructive use of technology when it comes to human trafficking. For example, women from developing countries are often enticed to go to Europe or North America and are falsely offered great paying jobs as models and actresses. Tragically, they end up in situations of human trafficking whereby their youth and beauty are exploited for pornography and the sex traffic trade. Or they become indentured slaves. They are practically enslaved and out of fear they feel trapped by their circumstances. Fortunately, there are organizations and religious communities dedicated to the liberation of those caught in the vicious web of human trafficking and exploitation.
