


News in the Diocese

Christians in the Middle East

Dear Parishioners:

The cradle of Christianity can be traced back to the First Century Palestine, from the time Our Lord Jesus commissioned the Apostles to "go out and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." (Matthew 28:19). The historical origin of our faith can be traced back to the ancient biblical lands of the Middle East.

While Christianity's roots can be traced to the Middle East, the Christian population is a small minority group. Christians now make up 5% of the total population, down from 20-30% at the early part of the 20th Century. Pope Francis once voiced concern that Christians will eventually disappear from the region amid "murderous indifference" to their plight. Aside from ongoing conflicts, Christians face economic and social hardships.

While on our recent Pilgrimage we became acutely aware of the challenges Christians face as we visited the holy sites in the area of Bethlehem. Our guide, Amal, was effusive in her gratitude to us because we took the time to visit the holy sites and help the local economy.

How can we help? Aside from going on a Pilgrimage to the Holy Land, we can be generous with our contribution on Good Friday. All Catholic Churches take up this special collection to assist the religious communities, especially the Franciscan Custodians of the Holy Land, The Franciscans maintain the religious sites so that all believers can visit and pray there and they support projects of education and development among the Christian residents.

Another way is to support the local economy. One of the religious stores where we shopped helps support the work of more than 70 artisans in Bethlehem. I brought a number of special religious articles - rosaries and images - made with the finest local material such as olive wood and mother of pearl. In the coming week the CWL will be selling these items at the back of the church. These special gift items are a reminder of our obligation to help the Christians in the land of our origin.
