

Care for the Dying



St. Theresa of Calcutta understood so well that the work of her Order, the Missionary Sisters of Charity, would not eradicate poverty, disease or premature death; however, she knew that by offering love, care and compassion to the most impoverished, it would give them a sense of dignity and worth, even at the end stage of life.

Many care facilities or hospice offer that same care and compassion in Canada. However, with the legalization of medical assisted suicide, there is government pressure to offer such procedures to all of their residents. A few facilities refuse to cower to government pressure. One such facility that operates outside of Vancouver is the Irene Thomas Hospice. The BC government insisted that they provide access to such lethal procedures since it is legal and the institution receives government grants. The hospice president, Angela Ireland, stood her ground and told the Ministry of Health that they were willing to give up \$750,000 in government grants in order to be true to their principles as a palliative care facility.

The managers of the Irene Thomas Hospice are to be applauded for standing by their principles and for advocating conscience rights in the face of a legal procedure that is morally wrong and reprehensible, similar to abortion. What is legal is not necessarily moral or in the best interest of those who access such procedures.

The distinction between caring and killing is becoming increasingly and regrettably blurred by governments that regard euthanasia as a component of health care. Angela Ireland recognizes the difference and deserves admiration for standing like David against the government Goliath.
