



News in the Diocese

Bible Sunday: Pope Francis has established the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time as Bible Sunday. This year it will be observed on Sunday, January 26, 2020. Prayer Cards will be distributed to each family at Mass on the weekend of January 25-26th. Parishioners are invited to offer this prayer together at the conclusion of the General Intercessions in thanksgiving for the gift of God's Word. Order forms for Bibles will also be available in each Parish on that weekend for parishioners who wish to purchase a Bible. We will also distribute a copy of *Getting to Know the Gospel of Matthew* by Fr. Scott Lewis, S.J., to each family. We pray that our observance of Bible Sunday will deepen our gratitude for the Word of God and inspire us to root our lives more firmly in the Word of God.



Dear Parishioners:

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Baptism of the Lord. The Christmas Season ends with this special feast. We are reminded of how Jesus was revealed to us - fully divine and fully human.

John the Baptist baptized for repentance. Jesus allowed himself to be baptized by John not because he needed to repent (he was perfect!) but because he wanted to totally identify with us. He is the only member of the human race who does not need forgiveness for his sins, and yet he humbled himself by being baptized in the Jordan River. He even identified with the effects of sin that we experience: suffering and death. It is comforting to know that Jesus identifies with us and our need for forgiveness and redemption. His act of humility increases our intimacy with him.

Each time we gather at Church we are reminded of our baptism as we bless ourselves with holy water from the font. May we be grateful to the Lord in this Eucharist for the gift of our baptism. We are truly blessed and privileged, for we are "...a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, in order that you may proclaim the mighty acts of him who called you out of darkness into his marvellous light." (1 Peter 2, 9).
