

Dear Parishioners:

Sunday, January 14 is the World Day of Prayer for Migrants and Refugees. Since the time of Pope Benedict XV in 1914, the Church has dedicated an annual Day of Prayer for migrants & refugees. For the 104th Day of Prayer, Pope Francis wrote in his opening remarks: "Every stranger who knocks at our door is an opportunity for an encounter with Jesus Christ, who identifies with the welcomed and rejected strangers of every age. The Lord entrusts to the Church's motherly love every person forced to leave their homeland in search of a better future." As the Pope elaborates in his message, there is a need for a commitment on the part of all societies to enact just and humanitarian laws that serve the greater good of those on the move.

Migration can easily lend itself to exploitation and abuse. The choice to leave one's homeland is often a difficult one between survival and devastation, opportunity and poverty, freedom and persecution. The Holy Father challenges us to a commitment of solidarity, openness, and fairness. We join our prayers with Pope Francis as he continues to preach a message of inclusion, compassion and justice.

Here in the Diocese of Hamilton we celebrate our diversity and openness to others with the Multicultural Mass at the Cathedral Basilica of Christ the King on Sunday, January 21 at 1:30 pm. In our own community, we have initiated the Hispanic Migrant Farmworkers ministry since last August, and as the workers return in the coming weeks we look forward to their presence among us again. We have a wonderful opportunity to continue to foster that sense of encounter and communion which Pope Francis speaks about in his message this year.
