

Dear Parishioners:

Christians are reminded of Jesus' prayer for his disciples that "they may be one so that the world may believe" (see John 17.21). Hearts are touched and Christians come together to pray for their unity. Congregations and parishes all over the world exchange preachers or arrange special ecumenical celebrations and prayer services throughout the year.

The event that touches off this special experience is the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. Traditionally the week of prayer is celebrated between 18-25 January, between the feasts of St. Peter and St. Paul. The theme for the week of prayer in 2019, "Justice, only justice you shall pursue" is inspired by Deuteronomy 16:20.

Here in our own area we see how vibrant ecumenism is among the different churches. We celebrated our ecumenical Advent service in late November and in the coming weeks and months we will celebrate our annual Day of Prayer (March), Decoration Sunday Service in August and the Remembrance Day Service in November. Moreover, we see how the different members of the respective communities will support each other's events and projects, such as our annual Chicken BBQ, the United Church's annual Bazaar or the local food bank run by the Baptist Church. Whether through prayer and song, service and social engagements, we see the handiwork of the Spirit bringing us ever so closer to the vision of unity and love envisioned by Christ.
