

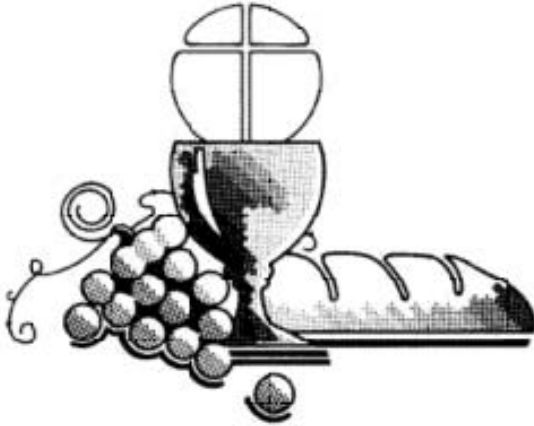

Dear Parishioners:

After much prayer, discernment and a very heartfelt conversation with Bishop Crosby, I have come to a difficult but necessary decision to ask to step down as Pastor of this community as of January 31. I will also be requesting dismissal from Priestly ministry.

This past year I have focused my efforts on my health. I appreciate all your support & encouragement. I realize that after nearly 23 years of Priestly ministry, I have put the needs of others before my own. I recognize the unique calling of the Priesthood, but it has its challenges, and one being the possibility of having a family.

Bishop Crosby expressed gratitude for the work I have done and re-assured me that a new Pastor will be in place in the coming weeks. For the month of February Fr. Al MacMillan has graciously offered to celebrate the weekend Masses.

My decision is entirely personal and one that I made after much prayer and reflection. As I told the Bishop, serving you has been the highlight of my Priestly ministry.

Moving forward I will still be serving the greater community but in a different capacity. I have accepted the position of Executive Director for the Centre for Migrant Workers Solidarity in Simcoe, ON. The Centre will continue to provide assistance and education for our migrant Farmworkers, as well as support our local farming industry. It is a work that I am very passionate about and it will be a different kind of service to God on behalf of our migrant workers.

I will do all I can to assist the parish in the coming weeks during this transition. Please continue to do all you can to continue the good work we have undertaken through your prayers, generosity & dedication. And please pray for me in this new phase of my life.

I will always be grateful for your support and generosity.
