

Re-Opening of Church: Welcome Back! After a little more than three months we thank God for the opportunity to gather once again. As you will see with our new signage, we ask that you monitor your own health, stay home if you have any flu like symptoms, sore throat, cold, fever, etc. If you feel you are high risk, stay home. If you feel more comfortable with less people, then attend weekday Mass. We strongly urge you to wear a mask at all times, except when you are about to approach Fr. Peter or the minister to receive the Communion host on the hand only. For seating, pews have been blocked off. We can sit three individuals, spaced properly, or a single family. Sanitize your hands as you enter. Please enter with proper distancing of more than six feet – both outside and inside of the church. Use the bathroom out of necessity - one person or family at a time. We have trained our new health and safety volunteers to assist you - the ones wearing the safety vests. Please listen to their instructions. They must be followed with no Thank you for your patience and questions. cooperation.

Mass on TV/Web: For those unable to attend, you can watch the Mass at home. <u>Vision TV</u>: Sunday at 8 am; Monday to Friday, 8 am and 12 noon. Saturday, 8:00 am and 9:30 am. <u>Salt & Light</u>: Monday – Saturday, 6:30 am and 9:30 am with the Pope. 11:00 am, 3:00 pm and 10:30 pm; Sunday 10:00 am and 11:30 pm. CHTV at 1:00 pm. You can also see the Mass anytime on the internet.

Blessing with the St. Anne Relic: The weekend of July 25-26 (all Masses), we will have special prayers for healing and invoke the intercession of St. Ann. Fr. Peter will bless the parishioners with a special relic of St. Ann at the end of Mass, a relic which has documented healings and special blessings. This year Fr. Mike Isabelle cannot join us, but he has graciously offered to allow us to use the relic this year.

Funeral Mass: We are allowed up to 50 people in church for a funeral Mass. This is the guidelines as mandated by the Bereavement Association of Ontario, the governing body that oversees the funeral homes. Seeds scattered and sown...



Dear Parishioners:

Today's Gospel reading invites us to reflect on the parable of the farmer who sows seeds in his field. Along with the good seeds appear the weeds. The parable invites us to trust that God's justice, despite what we see, will ultimately be exercised. Meanwhile, there is something important about the wheat – good people – accepting the presence of the weeds and continuing to be faithful to being good despite the weeds.

But we can also reflect how in each one of us reside both the good seeds (wheat) and the weeds. Why do they grow together within us? And what will happen to the weeds? By recognizing the weeds within us – our shortcomings – perhaps we will not be so ready to judge or demonize others when we see their faults and failures. Perhaps we also need to accommodate ourselves, without giving in, to our own weeds. We need to be patient in uprooting the weeds that need to be removed, both in ourselves and in others.

Ultimately, we respond to the Lord's call in building up the kingdom of God. It is an ongoing project that requires much patience, good soil, water, light, nutrients, etc. And sometimes it requires uprooting that which gets in the way or prevents growth. Christ, the patient Farmer, invites us to abide by His wisdom and love. In good time, the harvest of justice will be produced in abundance for all to see and enjoy.
