

Dear Parishioners:

Last weekend we celebrated the 150th Anniversary of Canadian Confederation. As part of our commitment to our country we offered a prayer of consecration to the Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary. But our work as citizens and people of faith continues. A new poll suggests more Canadians today (51 percent) believe religion does more harm than good, but even the pollsters disagree on what the numbers mean for the future of faith in the country.

Some analysts interpret the data as a reflection of Canadians' higher sensitivity to the news of religious radicals committing acts of violence and terrorism. Others point to a growing secularization of society. A noted sociologist who studies religious trends in Canadian society, Reginald Bibby, insists that Canadians are much more complex than what the data indicates.

For one thing, a fifty/fifty split means Canadians have been split on the value of religion for a number of years. Moreover in his own research Bibby found that 30 percent view religion as a central part of their lives, another 30 percent reject religion and another 40 percent are somewhere in the middle. For Bibby, the numbers can shift one way or the other depending on any number of social and cultural factors. However, there will always be a core group who value religion, especially since a growing number of new Canadians originate from nations that value religion.

When we read about such polls, we do not have to be disheartened. We can demonstrate to others how faith has made a positive impact in our lives and that indeed faith has a place and a vital role in the public square. Moving forward as a society, may our nation be mindful of the religious and spiritual values that have shaped and influenced us for the better.
