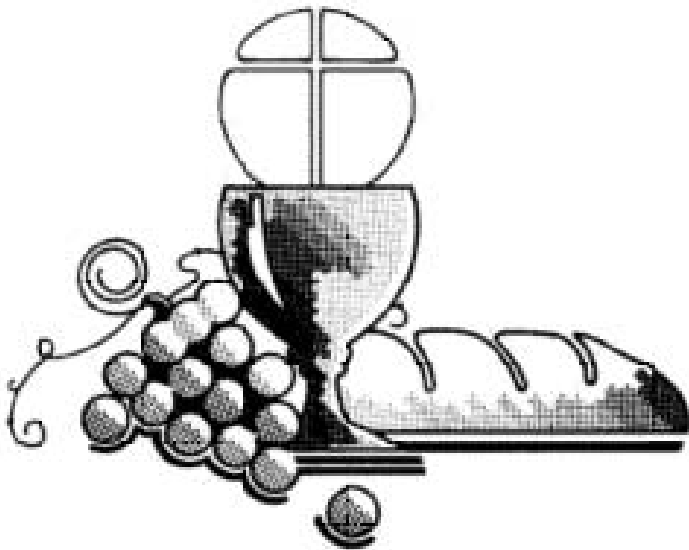

PARENTING TIP OF THE MONTH: Parenting Tip: Frenemies is a term used to describe a relationship where people are friendly but share an underlying dislike or rivalry. Parents can prevent sibling rivalry by remembering the following: allow each child to develop different interests; praise each child equally for their different gifts and talents; spend individual time with each child; refrain from taking sides in an argument but help children to work it out between themselves; engage in fun family activities together; pray for each other by name. Nativity of John the Baptist

June 24th

The precursor of our Lord. In the calendar of the Latin Rite of the Catholic Church, this is one of only three birthdays that we celebrate. With the other two being our Lord's (December 25) and our Lady's (September 8), this points to the significant role of John the Baptist in the history of human salvation. John was miraculously conceived to a barren couple. His birth and name were foretold to his father Zachariah by the Archangel Gabriel. For not believing Gabriel's message, Zachariah was made mute until all that Gabriel had proclaimed came to pass. Tradition holds that upon the visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary, when Elizabeth (his mother) was filled with the Holy Spirit, John was cleansed of Original Sin. As the one to prepare for the imminent coming of the Messiah, John described his ministry in terms of decreasing his own glory to increase the glory of the Messiah (c.f. John 3:30). This truth is taught even in the astronomical phenomenon surrounding the birthdays of John of the Baptist and our Lord Jesus Christ. Today marks one of the longest days in the year, and from this day forth the days will decrease in length. They shall decrease till about the time we celebrate the birthday of Jesus, at which time the days will increase in length.

Grant, we pray, almighty God, that your family may walk in the way of salvation and, attentive to what Saint John the Precursor urged, may come safely to the One he foretold, our Lord Jesus Christ.

**St. Aloysius Gonzaga
June 21st**

St. Aloysius was born in Castiglione, Italy. The first words St. Aloysius spoke were the Holy Names of Jesus and Mary. He was destined for the military by his father but by the age of 9 Aloysius had decided on a religious life and made a vow of perpetual virginity. To safeguard himself from possible temptation, he would keep his eyes persistently downcast in the presence of women. St. Charles Borromeo gave him his first Holy Communion. A kidney disease prevented St. Aloysius from a full social life for a while, so he spent his time in prayer and reading the lives of the saints. Although he was appointed a page in Spain, St. Aloysius kept up his many devotions and was quite resolved to become a Jesuit. His family eventually moved back to Italy, where he taught catechism to the poor. When he was 18, he joined the Jesuits, after finally breaking down his father, who had refused his entrance into the order. He served in a hospital during the plague of 1587 in Milan, and died from it at the age of 23, after receiving the last rites from St. Robert Bellarmine. The last word he spoke was the Holy Name of Jesus. St. Robert wrote the Life of St. Aloysius. He was named the patron saint of youth by Pope XIII in 1729.

O blessed Aloysius, adorned with angelic virtues, I, your most unworthy suppliant recommend specially to you the chastity of my soul and body, praying to you by your angelic purity to plead for me with Jesus Christ the Immaculate Lamb, and His most Holy Mother, Virgin of virgins, that they would vouchsafe to keep me from all grievous sin. Never suffer me to be defiled with any stain of impurity; *but when you see me in temptation, or in danger of falling, then remove far from my mind all evil thoughts and unclean desires, and awaken in me the memory of eternity to come, and of Jesus crucified; impress deeply in my heart a sense of the holy fear of God; and kindling in me the fire of Divine love, enable me so to follow your footsteps here on earth, that in heaven I may be made worthy to enjoy with you the vision of our God for ever.*
