



About Saint John the Baptist – Feast Day June 24th

The birth of St. John was foretold by an angel to the Lord to his father, Zechariah, who was offering incense in the Temple. It was the destiny of St. John to prepare the way of Christ. Even in the

womb, St. John knew the presence of Jesus and of Mary — leaping with joy at the glad coming of the Son of man. In his youth he remained hidden, because Jesus' life was hidden also. But before Christ's public life began, a divine impulse led St. John into the desert where in silence and in prayer, he began to purify his own soul. Then, as crowds broke in upon his solitude, he wanted them to flee from the wrath to come, and gave them the baptism of penance with water, while they confessed their sins. At last there stood in the crowd One whom St. John did not know, until a voice from within told him that it was his Lord, Jesus Christ.
