

Re-Opening of Church: Welcome Back! After a little more than three months we thank God for the opportunity to gather once again. As you will see with our new signage, we ask that you monitor your own health, stay home if you have any flu like symptoms, sore throat, cold, fever, etc. If you feel you are high risk, stay home. If you feel more comfortable with less people, then attend weekday Mass. We strongly urge you to wear a mask at all times, except when you are about to approach Fr. Peter or the minister to receive the Communion host on the hand only. For seating, pews have been blocked off. We can sit three individuals, spaced properly, or a single family. Sanitize your hands as you enter. Please enter with proper distancing of more than six feet – both outside and inside of the church. Use the bathroom out of necessity - one person or family at a time. We have trained our new health and safety volunteers to assist you - the ones wearing the safety vests. Please listen to their instructions. They must be followed with no Thank you for your patience and auestions. cooperation.

Mass on TV/Web: For those unable to attend, you can watch the Mass at home. <u>Vision TV</u>: Sunday at 8 am; Monday to Friday, 8 am and 12 noon. Saturday, 8:00 am and 9:30 am. <u>Salt & Light</u>: Monday – Saturday, 6:30 am and 9:30 am with the Pope. 11:00 am, 3:00 pm and 10:30 pm; Sunday 10:00 am and 11:30 pm. CHTV at 1:00 pm. You can also see the Mass anytime on the internet.

Singing during Mass: You will see that all the books and hymnals have been removed as part of the new requirement. Only our music leader and one cantor can sing during Mass. It is the sacrifice we make to gather again.

Special Mass June 29: On the Solemnity of St. Peter and St. Paul we will have a special Mass at 9:00 am. Please join us.

Sunday Coffee: For the time being we will not be having our coffee and social in the Hall after the 9:30 am Mass. As soon as Mass has ended, please leave your offertory envelope at the back and exit in an orderly fashion with proper distancing. Let's be patient and help one another!

The Sacrifice of Re-Opening

Dear Parishioners:

We give thanks to God that our churches have reopened for Masses, private prayer and devotions. For some it is too soon and for others it was about time. Regardless, we make every effort to make our churches a safe, welcoming space. Signs have been posted reminding us whether we should or should not enter the church, and social distancing, as we have been doing at the stores and pharmacy. I thank the volunteers who have stepped up to assist as part of our new health and safety team. So that they are identifiable. I have asked them to wear a safety vest. If you have any questions or concerns you can approach them or me. The next few weeks will be a learning process for everyone. Let us all do our part with patience and mutual support.

Since this is new for all of us, we will make mistakes. If I or a volunteer points something out, please do not take offense. We do so with the upmost care and concern for your safety and protection. As I said, this is new for all of us, and the current restrictions and norms may change.

Regarding masks or covering your mouth and nose with a handkerchief in church, I ask that you abide by that as a norm for the time being. I know it can be a nuisance. I myself do not like covering my face, but I do so for your benefit. Studies have shown that wearing a mask mitigates the spread of droplets coughing, sneezing or even talking a few feet away. In early March, prior to our lockdown in North America, a choir practice in Washington State (US) resulted in dozens of people contracting the virus. Human droplets are one of the main ways the disease spreads in public. I try to lead by example. The ministers and I do not wear a mask only when we are doing our part during the Mass. I will wear a mask prior to and after Mass. As for the Parish Office, that is mandatory by law. Anyone who enters the Office must wear a mask. So let us be patient, do our part and look out for each other.
