

Repent and Believe in the Gospel

Dear Parishioners:

This coming Wednesday is Ash Wednesday - a day that will mark the beginning of our Lenten season. As the ashes are marked on our foreheads we will hear the words, "*Repent and believe in the Gospel!*" We are reminded of our frailty and of our need for God in our lives.

Ash Wednesday is a day of penitential observance which includes fasting and abstinence. All Catholics over the age of 14 must refrain from eating meat and those between the ages of 18-60 are asked to fast, i.e., one main meal and two smaller meals. For medical reasons, one is exempted from fasting and abstaining and can substitute with another form of penance.

This ancient practice reminds us that we do not rely solely on our daily food for sustenance but the Word of God and His loving grace.

I encourage everyone to participate in the different liturgies, Reconciliation and devotions that we will celebrate throughout the Lenten season. Aside from prayer and fasting, we are invited to demonstrate extra care and compassion through alms giving - helping the St. Vincent de Paul who serve the poor and contributing to our Lenten food drive organized by the Knights of Columbus. Let us above all heed the Lord's invitation to renew our hearts and minds throughout this holy season of Lent.
