

## I will give you shepherds after my own heart (Jeremiah 3:15)...

Dear Parishioners:

Last week we celebrated World Day of Prayer for Vocations. I wish to share with you some reflections from Bishop Serge Poitras, Bishop of Timmins:

Fifty-five years ago this year...Pope Saint Paul VI established the first worldwide Day of Prayer for Vocations, in particular, priestly vocations. He wrote: "The problem of having a sufficient number of priests touches the faithful closely, not only because the religious future of society depends on it, but also because this problem is the clear and inexorable sign of the vitality of faith and love of parish and diocesan communities, as well as the spiritual health of Christian families."

On Good Shepherd Sunday we are invited to pray for vocations to the priesthood in a very special way. As Christ himself wished, and as the Church has always understood and taught, there can be no Catholic Church without priests. In the name and person of Christ the Head of the Church, priests alone can preside at the Eucharistic celebration...Only priests can pardon sins and reconcile the faithful with God and the Church (John 20:23); only they can administer the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick to those who are ill (James 5:14-16).

We pray for these vocations because we believe that the priesthood, as Christ instituted it, is necessary. We do not pray for something we do not believe in.

May God bless our Church with an abundance of vocations!
